**Abstract of collection:** Collection focuses on the Andrews Sisters, Georgia Gibbs and Rose Murphy. **Biography notes:** Robert Boyer (born 1942) worked in the Department of Agriculture's Motion Picture Service and spent time as a script writer and film editor. He was a collector of Andrews Sisters memorabilia, as well as memorabilia for other female musicians.

**Processing information:** Collection is organized into four series: 1) Biographical Information; 2) Audio and Visual records; 3) Print publications (sheet music copies of their songs, as well as articles); 4) Miscellaneous.
